In London, there are many pet owners who are unable to afford day-to-day veterinary treatment, and find themselves in an extremely difficult position, especially if their animal falls ill or suffers an injury. Thankfully, we are very fortunate to have several charities who help people who are on means-tested benefits, have low incomes or are homeless. Although the charities outlined in the leaflet provide a free veterinary service, they rely entirely on donations and legacies and often ask for a contribution towards the cost of the treatment.



These organisations also help with the problem of the growing number of stray animals in London by enforcing strict neutering schemes, micro-chipping and the rehoming of unwanted animals. They are a good source of information, and will often provide free advice on any concerns pet owners have on their animal's health or behaviour.

We have many reasons to be proud of our city and our support to animal welfare is definitely one of these, as I believe the level of animal welfare reflects on the quality of life of a city's inhabitants.

I am pleased to have been able to assist in the production of this booklet. I hope that it will play its part in helping animal welfare in I ondon.

# 1 The Blue Cross



The Blue Cross is Britain's pet charity, providing practical support, information and advice for pet owners. The Blue Cross hospitals provide veterinary care for the pets of people who cannot afford private vets' fees. It runs hospitals in Victoria, Hammersmith and Merton. The Blue Cross has launched a mobile clinic in partnership with the Greater London Authority, enabling veterinary care to be delivered locally within some authorities in the East End of London. The Blue Cross hope to be able to expand the service to other areas of London in the future.

The charity operates an ambulance and community nurse service to assist those of its clients who are housebound due to age or disability and unable to attend the hospitals themselves.

The opening times of the hospital clinics are given below. Animals are seen by appointment only (except in emergency) – please contact the individual hospital. A 24-hour emergency service is provided at Victoria hospital for the clients of all three hospitals.

# 2 Cats Protection



Cats Protection is the UK's leading feline welfare charity. Neutering of all cats and kittens not required for breeding is one of Cats Protection's main aims. Every year, the charity assists with the cost of neutering up to 100,000 UK cats through various initiatives.

Cat owners on a low income who need to have their pet neutered should call Cats Protection's Helpline on **08702 099 099** or check online at **www.cats.org.uk** for details of the work of Cats Protection and how we could assist. This will give details of your nearest Cats Protection Branch or Shelter.

Neutering is the only practical way to reduce the number of unwanted felines in the UK, and, as a charity committed to a non-euthanasia policy (except on veterinary advice), volunteers and staff work hard to try and find loving homes for every feline that comes into Cats Protection's care.

People are sometimes reluctant to have their cat neutered thinking that it's unmanly or that it's kinder to let a female cat have one litter of kittens, but neutered cats are safer, happier, healthier and make better pets.

Population control for cats is very important, as felines are prolific breeders. A conservative estimate is that one unneutered female cat can produce up to 18 kittens a year, or 20,000 descendants over five years.



# 3 Celia Hammond Animal Trust



The Celia Hammond Animal Trust offers low cost neutering, vaccination and microchipping clinics for cats, dogs and other animals belonging to people on benefits, or those unable to afford private veterinary fees. It also has sanctuary accommodation and runs a rescue and rehoming service for stray and unwanted animals. # 4 Dogs Trust



Dogs Trust is the UK's largest dog welfare charity, and cares for over 11,500 dogs every year.

Dogs Trust are working towards the day when all dogs can enjoy a happy life, free from the threat of unnecessary destruction.

To achieve that aim the charity does more than rehoming, and is heavily involved in campaigns for neutering, microchipping and education. Last year more than 29,000 dogs were neutered through subsidised neutering schemes that are run throughout the campaign areas.

Dogs Trust Hope Project provides free preventative and emergency healthcare for dogs whose owners are either homeless or in housing crisis, through a veterinary entitlement card scheme run in conjunction with participating homelessness organisations and veterinary surgeries.

Preventative treatments provided through the scheme include; vaccinations, microchipping, neutering, worming and flea treatment. Emergency treatment will also be provided in the event of a dog suffering from a life threatening disease of injury.

Owners must be homeless or in housing crisis (e.g. sleeping rough, squatting, living in B&B accommodation, a hostel or travelling) and should be either registered as homeless with one of the participating organisations or be able to prove their NFA status.

Joint Dogs Trust/Beaumont Animal Hospital Neutering Scheme provides subsidised neutering for both male and female dogs. Owners must be in receipt of benefits or a government pension, and provide this proof when attending the hospital. Neutering is offered at a heavily

reduced rate, and depending on the size of the dog ranges from £30 - £60.





# 5 The Free Neutering for Cats Scheme (Greater London)



The free neutering for cats scheme offers free neutering for cats of owners who are on benefits, pensions or low income, and for stray cats.

It also helps people with large numbers of cats and will consider applications from anyone unable to afford to neuter their cats.

The scheme aims to reduce the large number of stray and unwanted cats in the capital and is funded and run by a consortium of charities: RSPCA, Cats Protection, Animal Aid and Advice, Association for the Rescue of Cats in Haringey, Cat Action Trust 1977 and the SNIP.

Successful applicants receive a free neutering voucher for use at one of over 150 private and charity vets supporting the scheme throughout Greater London. Telephone **020 7355 1677** for details or to send for an application form please write to:

# 7 The PDSA – The People's Dispensary for Sick Animals



Founded in 1917, PDSA is Britain's leading veterinary charity, providing free care to the sick and injured pets of those unable to afford private veterinary fees.

PDSA's 46 PetAid hospitals provide more than one million free treatments each year, equivalent to more than 4,500 sick and injured pets being treated by PDSA vets and nurses every working day. This year, PDSA PetAid services will cost £33 million. They are funded entirely by public support, mainly through donations and gifts in wills.

To be eligible for free PDSA treatment, a pet owner must live within the designated postcode area of a PetAid hospital or PetAid practice and be in receipt of either Housing Benefit or Council Tax Benefit. The RSPCA's work covers the whole range of animal protection including practical welfare, education, campaigning and law enforcement. The RSPCA employs teams of staff who respond to calls about animal cruelty or neglect. The charity also acts as an emergency service for injured, trapped or stranded animals and finds new homes for animals in need. There are many local RSPCA branches across London, along with animal centres and clinics in Ealing, Kilburn, Camberwell, Holloway, East Finchley, Putney, New Addington and Edmonton which are open to people in receipt of benefits.
