Put and End to Antifreeze Poisoning!



Many cats, dogs and wild animals still die each year from antifreeze poisoning. Animals find the sweet taste of antifreeze pleasant, and therefore will often ingest it. Just a few licks can lead to kidney failure within hours, and unless treated swiftly, oftens results in death.

There is currently an online petition, requesting that antifreeze preparations are banned in the EU unless they contain a bittering agent to repel animals, and the labels are clearly marked with warnings & hazard symbols.

Remember to keep antifreeze in suitable, clearly labelled, sealed containers, away from pets. Clean up leaks and spills instantly, and dispose of antifreeze, screenwash and radiator coolant safely. If you suspect your cat or dog may have been been poisoned, you should take them to your vet immediately.

Putting FIV into Perspective

Catwork Sanctuary in Somerset has been rescuing, caring for and rehoming cats with special needs since 1996. Run by Barbara and Bob, Catwork has helped a huge number of cats over the years, including over 80 cats with the FIV virus, many of who might otherwise have been needlessly euthanized.

Last year, Barbara and Bob decided to put their first-hand experience of years of living with so many FIV-positive cats into print, and in October "80 FIV Cats" had it's first print run (the first of many we hope) in the form of this 105-page booklet. It's not a scientific study, or a medical journal; it's simply an honest, practical, first-hand account of caring for more than 80 FIV cats over the last fifteen years.

Barbara and Bob explain why they wrote the book:

"We took in our first FIV positive cat in 1997, since when we have cared for more than 80 cats with the virus. Through the experience of caring for these cats, we have learned what the FIV virus really means to a cat. There is, sadly, a great deal of misunderstanding about the virus. What one reads is mainly based on academic theory rather than practice, making it misleading at best.

We have done the best we can for those who have come our way, but we are getting too old to take on more - we know how long they can live! So the best we can now do is pass on what our FIV cats have taught us to as many others as we can, so they can deal properly with the FIV cats that come their way.

We want as many people as possible to have the information in order for them to give all future FIV cats the chance they deserve of a good life. That is why we have produced the booklet.

Please do what you can for FIV cats, even if it is just passing on the booklet to those who may deal with FIV cats.

The cats have taught us, now we want them to teach you."





Cat Homing and Rescue - CHAR



Cat Homing and Rescue (CHAR) are a voluntary organisation Based in Warrington, Cheshire, founded over 10 years ago by a dedicated group of cat lovers.

They rescue and re-home cats and kittens throughout north Cheshire and south Lancashire, and neuter, vaccinate and vet-check all cats that come into their care. As well as offering their rescue and rehoming services to domestic moggys, and pedigree cats, CHAR also lends a paw to feral cats, and are often in need of homes for working cats eg. stables, small-holdings, farms etc.

Rehabilitation and rehoming cats with various disabilities is something this organisation pride themselves on. They are also available for guidance on cat related matters, and support to the public at times of loss or bereavement.



If cats could talk, there is one cat; Samson, who could tell you a lot about this remarkable organisation:

A Warrington vet contacted CHAR and asked if they would be willing to rescue a badly injured cat, and fund his much needed surgery.

Little Samson's front leg and opposite back leg both had compound fractures, and his owners couldn't be traced. As funds are so desperately short, CHAR asked if the vet would be willing to accept monthly installments for this - and the rest is history! After surgery, and 6 weeks in plaster, Samson did remarkably well, and he now lives with one of the shelter's volunteers. He is a very happy strong gentle cat who literally survived against all the odds, to walk and play again!

Another cat currently at Cat Homing and Rescue; Lucky, is hoping fate will smile down on him too: Loveable Lucky is the most adorable, affectionate boy, who loves being made a fuss of. He is around 3-4 years old, loves his cuddles, and will make the most loving pet. He is looking for a home without other cats or dogs as they make him a little wary, but generally he is a very laid back chap with so much to give. His fosterer says he likes to follow her around when they are outside together. Please contact CHAR if you feel Lucky is the boy for you!
